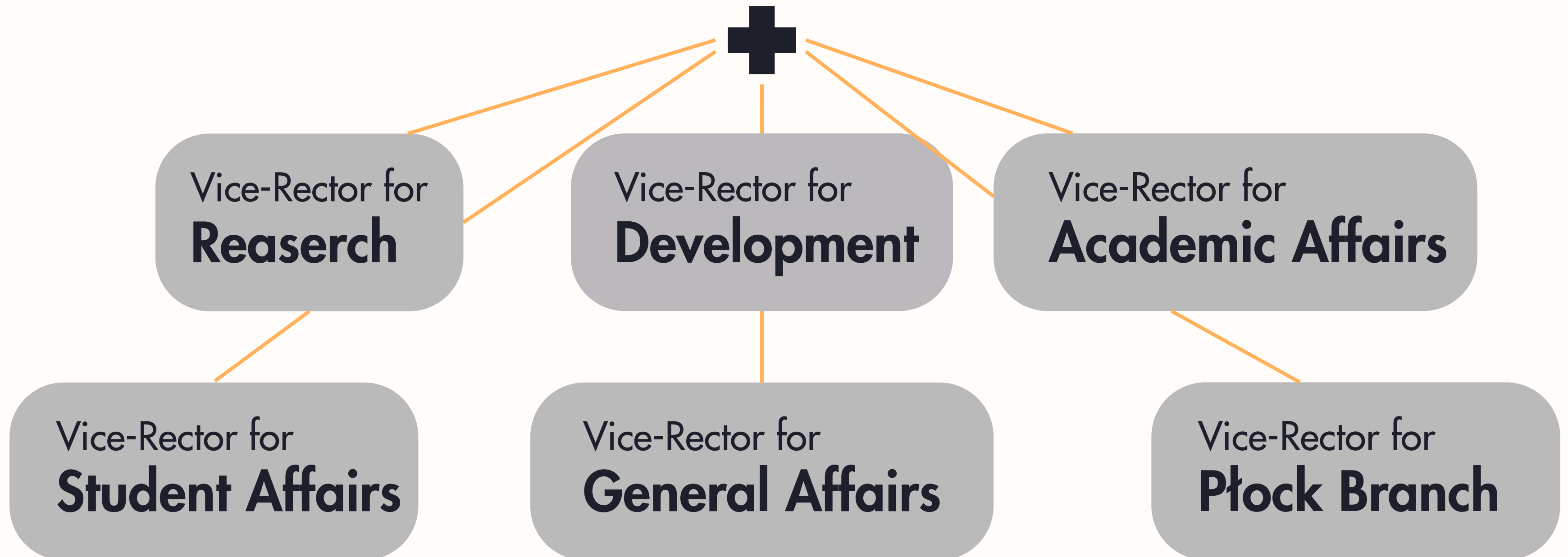

University Structure

Rector

His Magnificence



University

His Magnificence the Rector represents the entire Warsaw University of Technology nationally and internationally. He is responsible for the University's most important decisions, its financial management, and its strategy.

Vice-Rector for General Affairs oversees administration, manages the WUT's finances, and collaborates with organizations operating at our University.

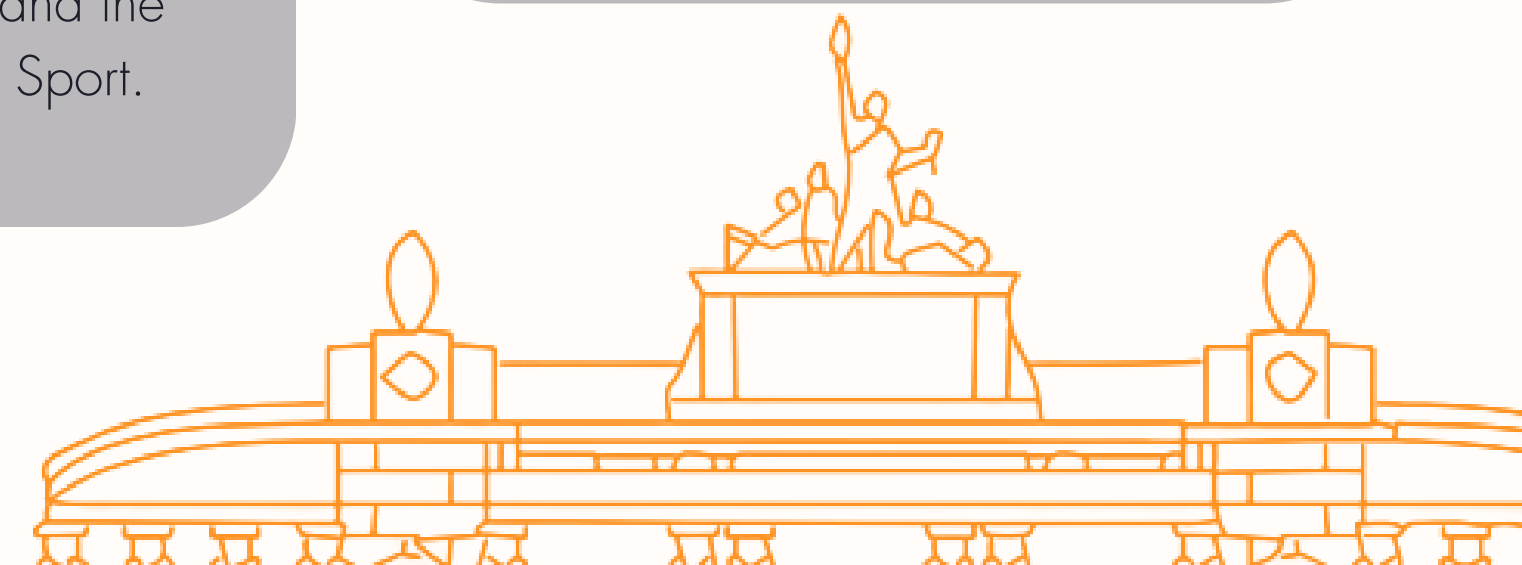
Vice-Rector for Development closely supervises investments and public procurement. He oversees the University's budget.

Vice-Rector for Student Affairs collaborates with representatives of all student and doctoral organizations. He handles recruitment, coordinates promotional activities for the University, and has a significant influence on cultural life, social, and living matters of the student community.

Vice-Rector for Academic Affairs oversees the quality of education. He oversees matters related to the adoption of study regulations. He oversees the Department of Foreign Languages and the Department of Physical Education and Sport.

Vice-Rector for Research responsible for research funding. Supervises the university's research staff and influences the degrees assigned to employees.

Vice-Rector for the Płock Branch represents the branch. He also oversees the branch's activities and coordinates its development strategy.



Faculty

Dean - This is the most important person at the faculty. The Dean represents the faculty, makes decisions related to its operation, and manages funds. He collaborates with the **Students' Union Faculty Council** and the Doctoral Students' Council. He is responsible for the **Faculty Council**, where all plans related to the life of the faculty and current events are discussed.

The Dean would not be able to cope without the support of the **Vice-Deans**. Their number and competences vary slightly at each faculty, depending on the specifics of the unit. However, the most common types include:

Every faculty needs organizational units that define a certain teaching area carried out in the faculty. These are called **departments, chairs** or **institutes**.

The faculty administration is responsible for all formal and financial matters.

The Dean's Office (Dziekanat) is a place you'll visit many times. It primarily handles matters related to admissions, student ID cards, and scholarships.

Regulations

Every student has and should be aware of their rights so that, in case of disputes, they know how to act in accordance with the regulations in force at Warsaw University of Technology.

Where to find information?

The Study Regulations are a document containing all the necessary information. Every student has the right to receive training on their rights and responsibilities. This is implemented by your Students' Union Faculty Council (WRS) at the beginning of your studies to clarify the most basic regulations.

Questions?

If you have any doubts regarding the regulations, please contact your Students' Union Faculty Council (WRS) or the Faculty Student Ombudsman. They will be happy to help you and explain each section.

Remember that, in addition to you, instructors must also comply with the Study Regulations!

Email in the PW domain

As a WUT student, you receive access to the Office 365 suite. To generate a password, log in to USOS - "For Students" tab > "Office 365" > "Reset password." Access to this account will be necessary to communicate with instructors or participate in remote classes (e.g., via the MTeams platform). All important information regarding your studies will be sent to this email (in Outlook), so it's worth monitoring it.

Formal Communication

When communicating with your instructors, always treat them with respect. Remember these few rules when writing an email:

- Include the academic title of the person you're writing to (you can find it on the Faculty website or in the repo. In that case, you need to Google "<name> repo pw".)
- If you know the email title, you can start with something like "Dear Professor <name> PhD, DSc"
- Remember about "best regards" in the end
- Avoid "hello."
- If the matter concerns the entire group, choose a representative to compose the group email.

WUT Foreign Language Center (SJO)

Every undergraduate student is required to complete **180 hours** of language classes and obtain a certificate of foreign language proficiency at the B2 level. Without passing the B2 exam, you cannot receive a first-cycle diploma.

You can pass the exam with an external certificate recognized by WUT (a list of these can be found on the website under the Examination Committee tab) or by passing the exam organized by the WUT Foreign Language Center (SJO). After passing the B2 exam, you can apply for an ACERT certificate.

You can take the exam in your chosen session, starting from the first semester of your studies. It should be passed no later than the last semester of your language studies, according to the program of study at the given faculty.

After passing the B2 exam, you can enroll in **thematic courses** in English and other modern languages. A list is available on the website.

Physical Education Center (SWFIS)

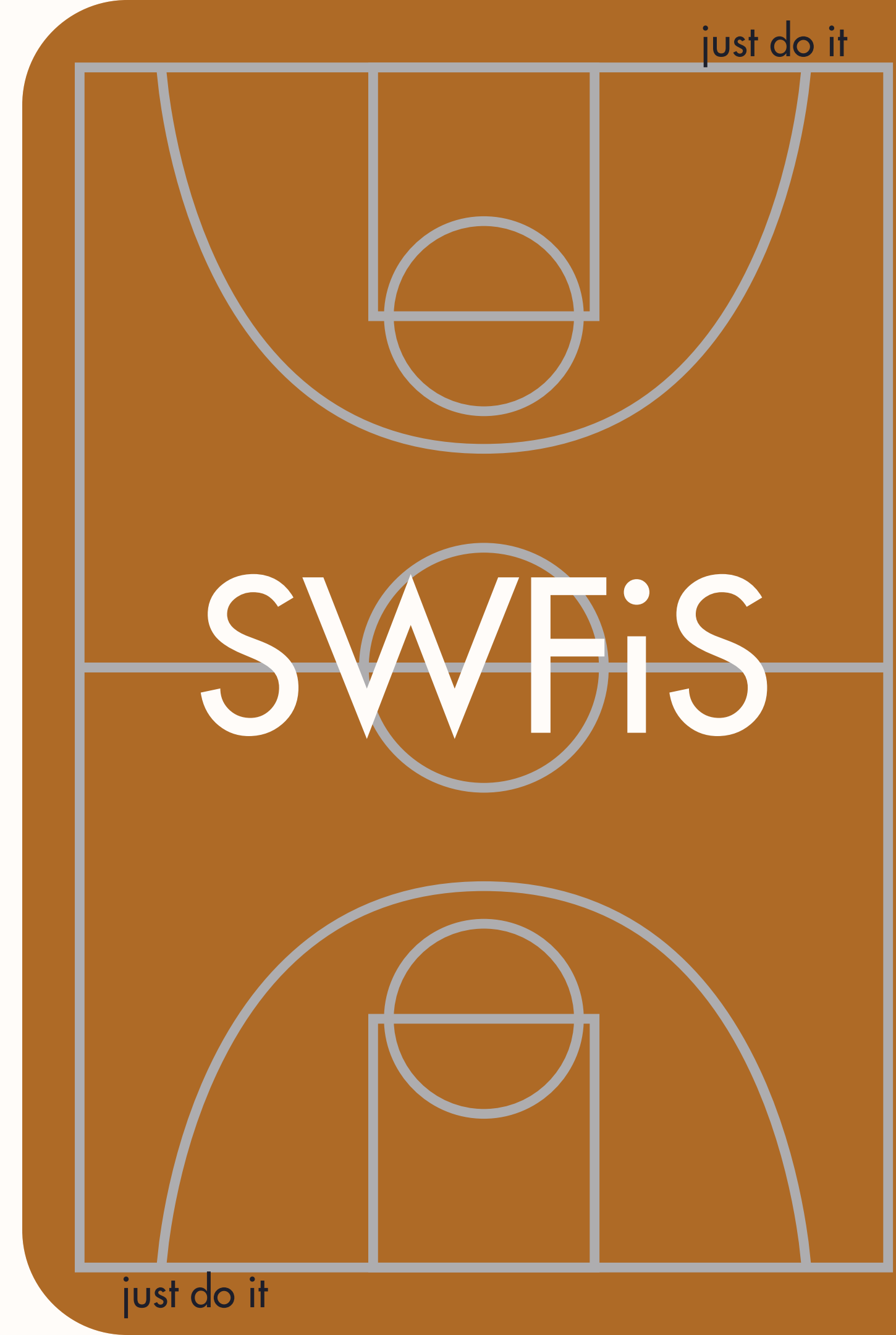
To register for your chosen PE class, please register in the USOS system. This works on a first-come, first-served basis, and space in each group is limited.

If you are unable to register for a class on the scheduled date, or you wish to choose a time that works better for your schedule, you must attend the first class and register directly with the instructor.

Complete PE credits consist of **three semesters**. Your department determines the semesters in which the course must be completed.

Semester credits depend on attendance. Some disciplines require a fee. A detailed list of available disciplines can be found on the SWFiS website.

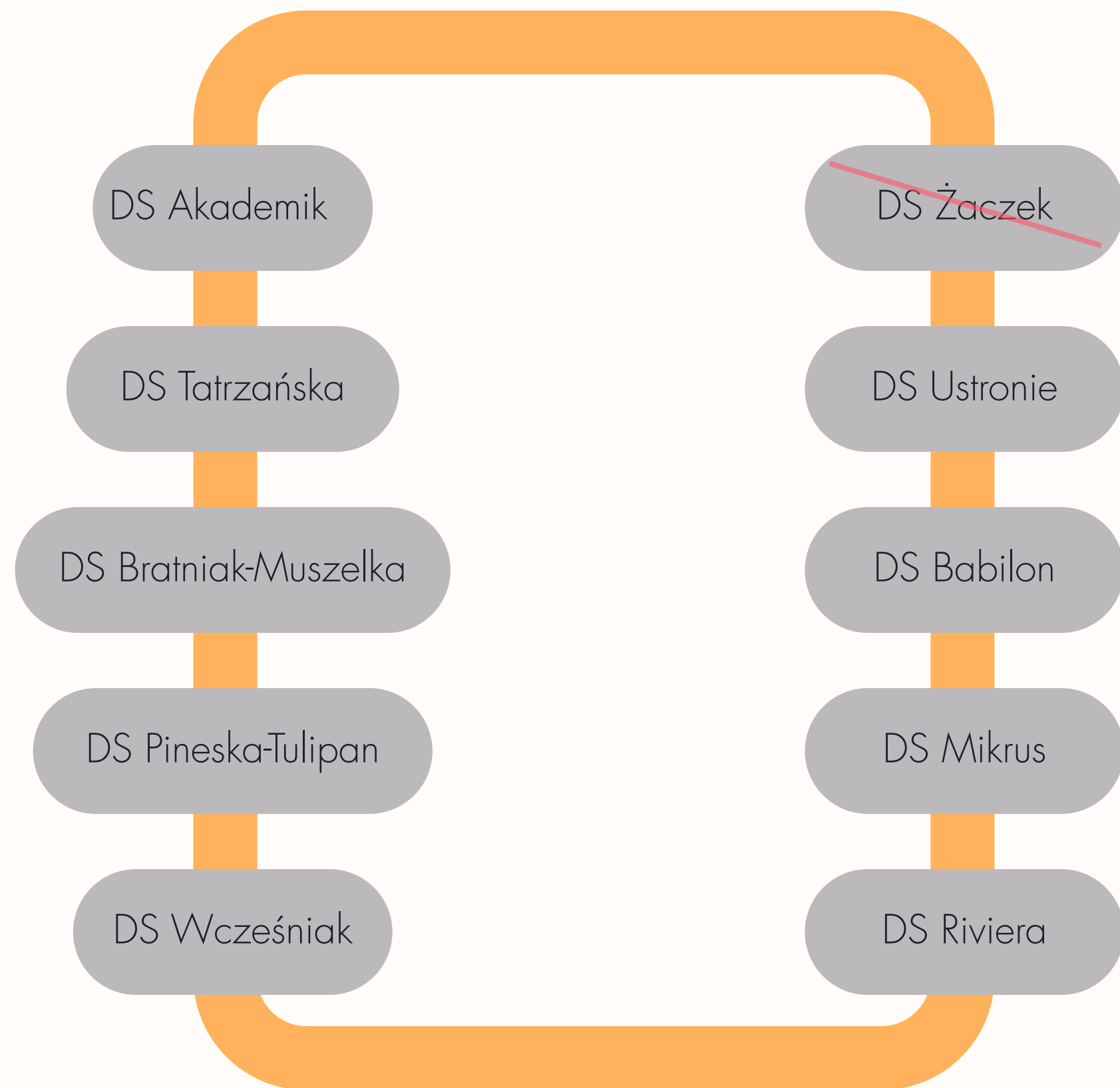

The Students' Union acts on behalf of students by addressing: social and welfare issues (scholarships and allowances), striving for a high level of education, supporting students' scientific development, and fostering international educational programmes.

It is composed of democratically elected representatives from the Students' Union Faculty Councils, Dormitory Councils of Residents, and other organizations.

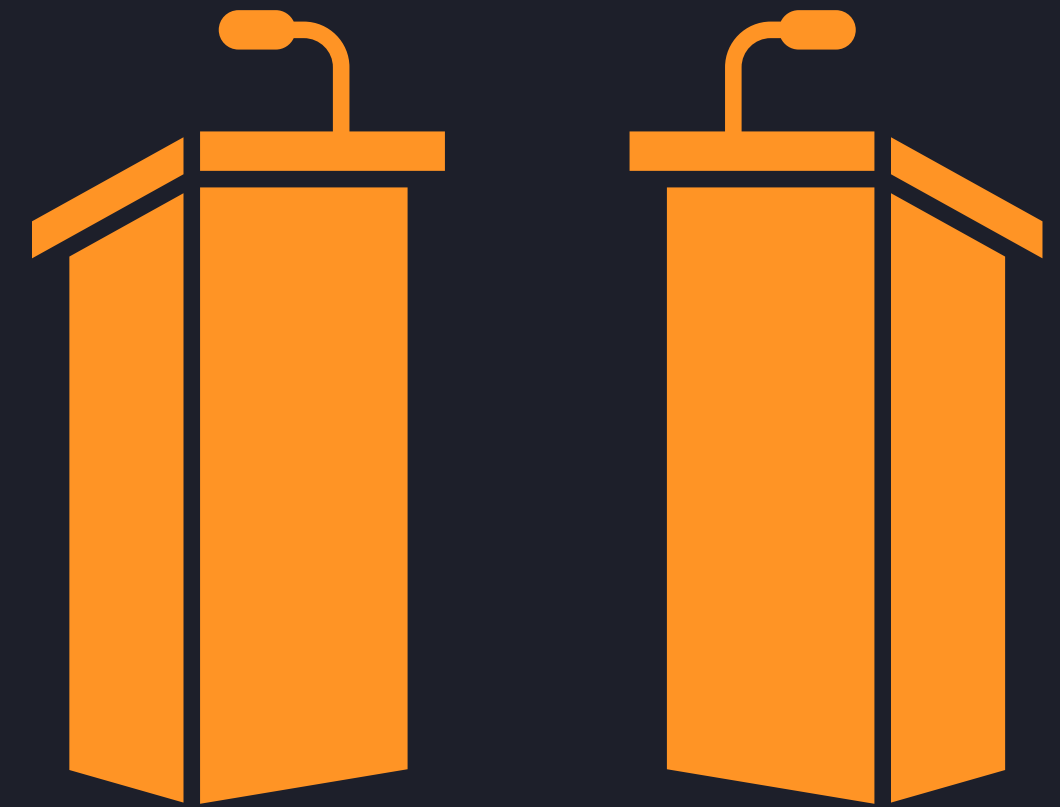
It appoints the President of the Students' Union of the Warsaw University of Technology, Programme Committees, and Student Senators.

Who and What?

The Students' Union bodies closest to you will be the **Students' Union Faculty Council**, and if you live in a dormitory — also the **Dormitory Council of Residents**.



Students' Union Faculty Council (WRS)

Students' Union Faculty Council works within various committees such as the Faculty Scholarship Committee, Faculty Accommodation Committee, and represents students at the Faculty Council and the Academic Affairs Committee. If you're looking for great events or need advice — WRS is there for you.

Dormitory Council of Residents (RM)

Dormitory Council of Residents — the equivalent of WRSs in student dormitories.

They organize student life in dormitories, manage common areas, cooperate with dormitory administration, and arrange cultural events (e.g. Akademikalia festival).

Committees

Economic and Financial Committee – allocates funds for various areas of student activities.

Academic Affairs Committee - cooperates with university authorities regarding study regulations and collaborates with Student Research Groups.

Student Accommodation Committee – responsible for student housing in dormitories.

Digital Affairs Committee – works on improving Students' Union systems and digital solutions.

Student Dormitories Committee - cooperates with Dormitory Councils of Residents, addresses ongoing issues, and plans dormitory modernization.

Communications and External Cooperation Committee - supports and promotes student projects and works on securing sponsors.

Sports and Tourism Committee – organizes sports events and promotes physical activity in cooperation with the Academic Sports Association and tourist organizations.

International Affairs Committee - supports international cooperation and student exchange, and operates in the area of European educational programmes.

Cultural Affairs Committee - organises various cultural events such as the Central Freshers' Initiation, a series of Culture Days events, and trips to cultural institutions. It supports cultural initiatives of basic units.

Student Welfare Committee – allocates funds from the state budget for various forms of material aid, such as social scholarships and allowances.

Do you want to pursue interesting research projects outside of your studies?

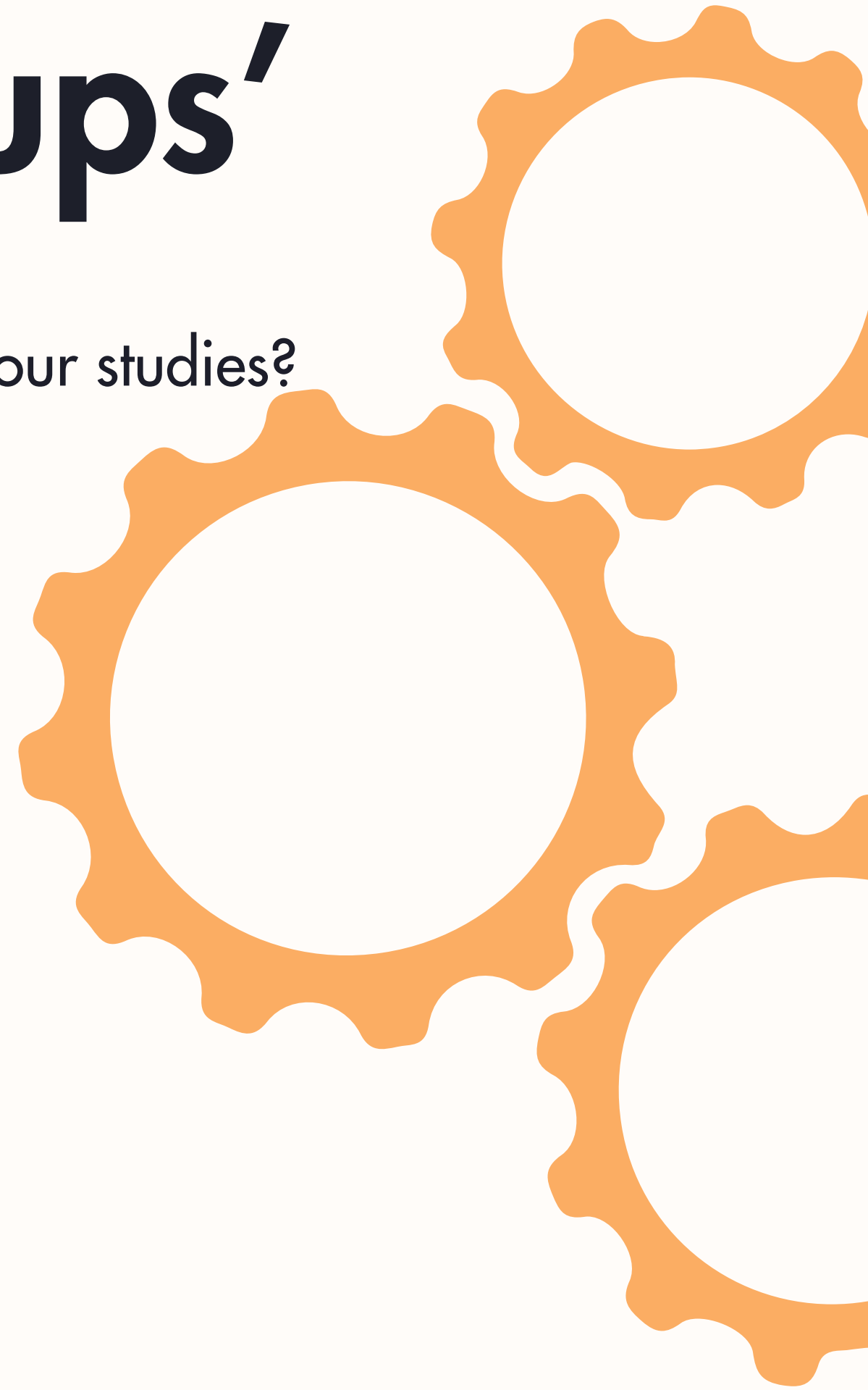
Or perhaps you're looking for people with similar interests?

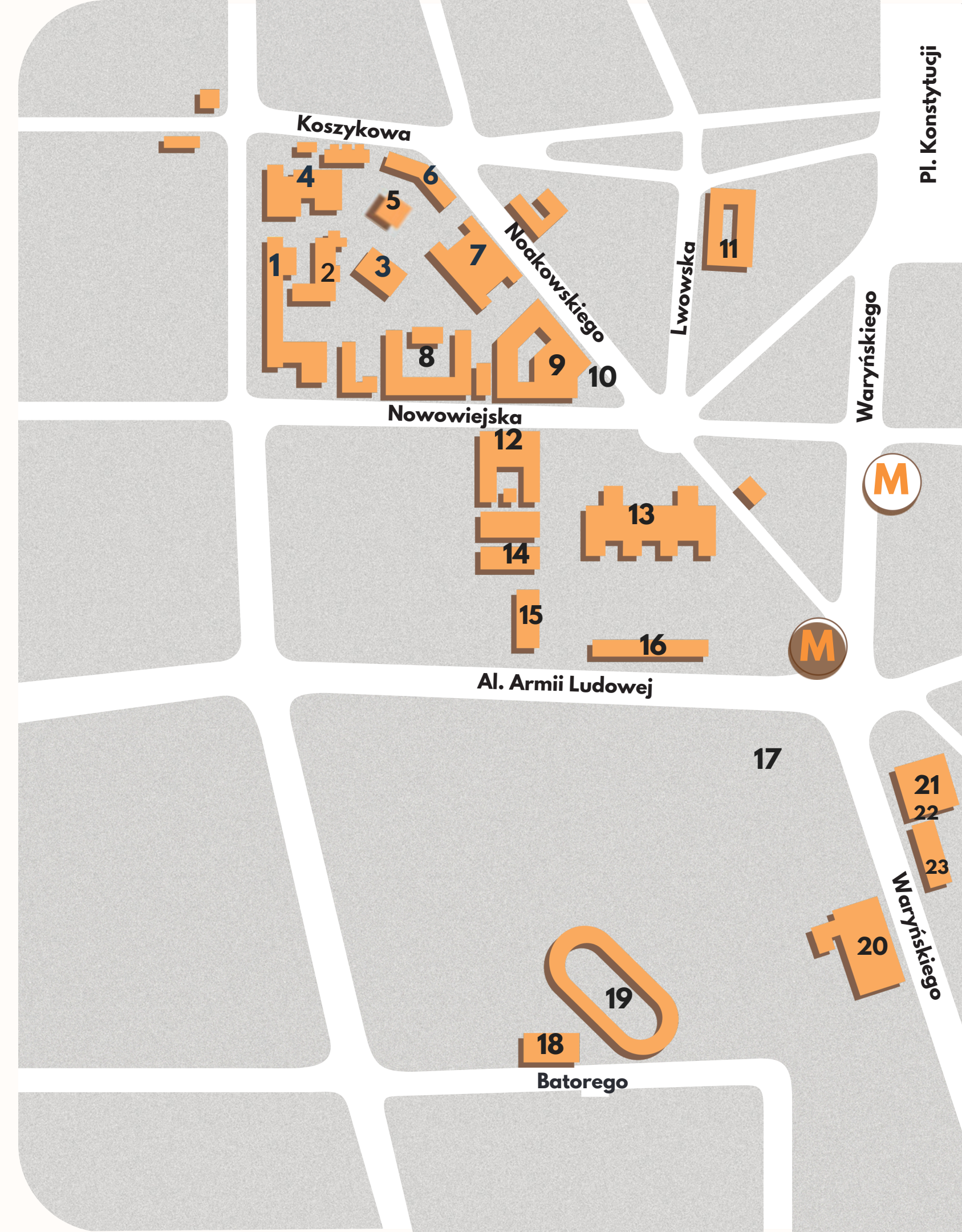
Univeristy Map

South Campus consists of faculties located in the vicinity of Narbutta Street.

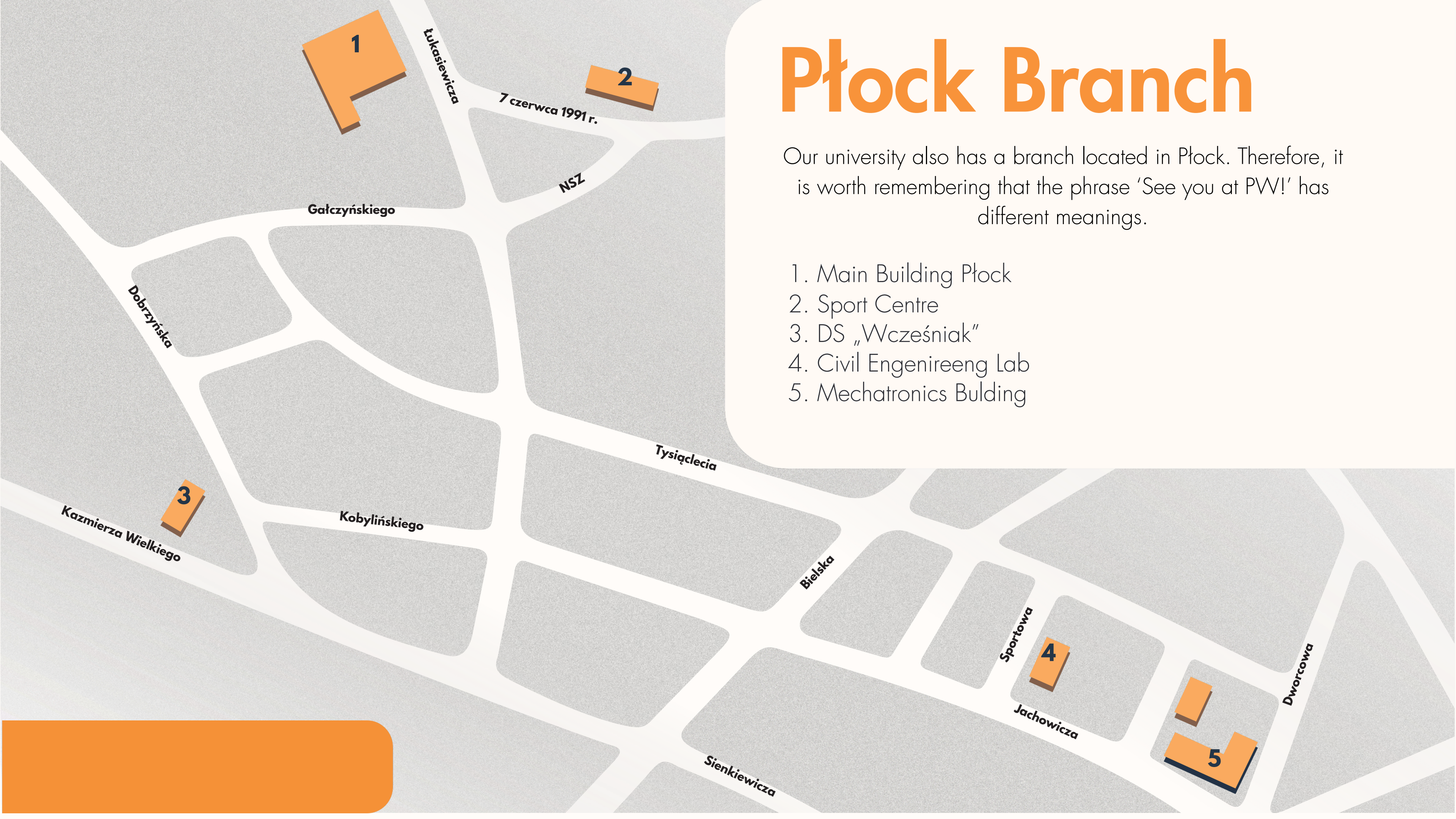

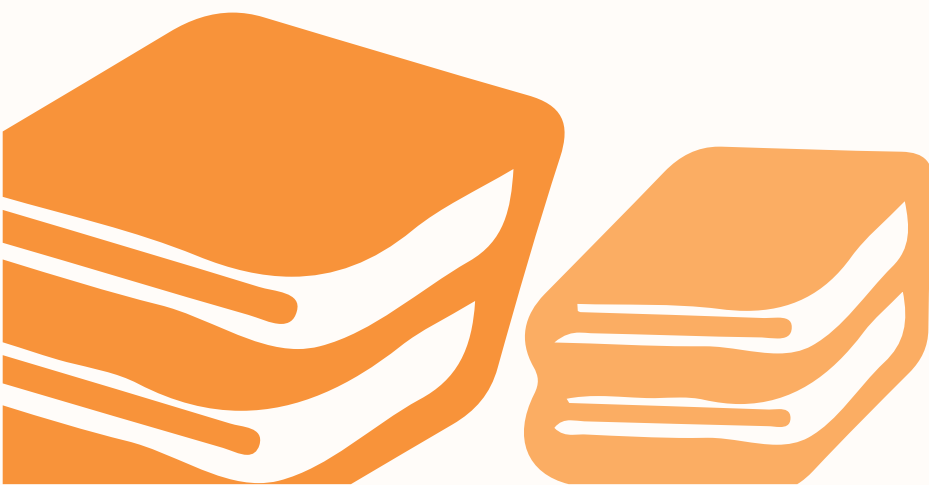

Getting there

Public transport

Studying and living in Warsaw requires constant movement around the city. Warsaw's public transport system comes to the rescue. It may not be perfect, but above all, it is cheap, more environmentally friendly than your own car, and allows you to get practically anywhere at any time of the day or night.

At the very beginning of your life in Warsaw, it may be quite difficult to figure out what goes where, at what time and from which stop. That is why we recommend using the free Google Maps or Jakdojade app. There you will easily find all timetables, departure schedules from the relevant stops, and you will also be able to search for any connection from point A to point B.

Tickets

Unfortunately, public transport is not free. If you expect to travel frequently, the best option is a quarterly city card. However, if you live close to the University of Technology and your journeys by public transport will be sporadic, remember to buy traditional time-limited or transfer tickets.

Fun fact

You can encode your city card on your student ID. One less thing to carry in your wallet.

Parking campaign



Would you like to commute to university by car but are concerned about the lack of parking spaces?

There is no need to worry. Every semester, there is a parking campaign during which you can apply for a parking space on the BIS PVV premises.

If you plan to get a parking card, you need to act quickly: parking campaigns usually take place at the beginning of the semester.

Few Protips

Protips for good start...

- Collaborate with people (it's especially helpful to have friends in the WRS and in your higher year).
- Attend the first classes and lectures to understand the requirements for passing the course.
- Don't underestimate the September session!
- Maintain good relationships with the Dean's Office (dziekanat). You'll often be dealing with things there.
- Find the optimal workflow for you. Studies require a fair amount of independence.
- Don't worry about the requirements. It's difficult to graduate without repeating a course.
- Keep track of your ECTS credits to control the number you might lose. It's worth knowing which courses you can skip.
- Don't forget about the academic degrees of your professors.
- Approach everything with a healthy perspective. Instructors can lose their tempers.
- Find out if there's a disk with materials from previous years available.
- Keep a calendar (preferably an academic one); it really helps!
- Follow the WRS website. It's worth keeping up with the world of WUT!
- Always try to take zero-day exams if your instructor allows it. An early opportunity to pass an exam is always a good thing!
- Familiarize yourself with the course regulations! They contain the most important information.
- Knowing them can help ensure your rights are not violated.
- Remember that studies are not just about studying! Learn about the activities of your WRS, your Student Research Group, or what other student organizations offer.

Student Glossary

Glossary

- WUT Students' Union (SSPW) – The Students' Union of the Warsaw University of Technology. A structure composed of students, operating in close cooperation with the University authorities.
- Students' Union Faculty Council (WRS) – A body present at every faculty of WUT. Responsible for assisting students and representing their interests before faculty authorities.
- Main Building (GG) – The Main Building of the Warsaw University of Technology.
- Main Library (BG) – The Main Library of the Warsaw University of Technology, located in the Main Building.
- Dormitory Council of Residents (RM) – The equivalent of the Faculty Students' Union Council within student dormitories.
- Dormitory (DS) – Student housing facilities known as "dormitories." The colloquial term "Akademik" comes from the oldest WUT dormitory — DS Akademik, also known as "Alcatraz." Dormitories provide accommodation, study spaces, and recreation for students. Key advantages include affordable prices, proximity to the University, and a vibrant student community.
- Office for Student Affairs (BSS) – An administrative unit responsible for coordinating and supervising student-related and educational matters, such as administrative support for student issues and providing information services.
- USOS (University Study-Oriented System) – The University Study-Oriented System — an academic management IT system. Commonly used as an online student portal featuring class schedules, staff directories, and grades.
- South Campus (Południe) – The southern part of the Warsaw University of Technology, located significantly away from the central campus. Use of public transport is recommended.
- ECTS (European Credit Transfer System) – Points awarded for successful completion of a course. A specific number of ECTS points is required to complete a semester and continue studies. The number of points varies depending on the course. Students receive either the full ECTS points or none.
- "Zerówka" (Integration Camp) – Integration trips organized by the Students' Union or other student organizations. A great opportunity to make new friends before starting your studies at WUT.
- Elective Course (Obierak) – A course chosen from a pool of electives based on personal interests. Elective courses include language classes, physical education, or specialized courses within the study programme.
